The National E-Invoicing Initiative (NEI) aims to drive interoperable E-Invoicing by digitalising delivery of invoices between businesses, allowing different accounting software and Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system to send and receive e-invoices in a systemto-system manner. Malaysia Digital Economy Corporation (MDEC), as Malaysia's Peppol authority, plays an important role for businesses to unlock the commercial value in the implementation of e-invoicing.

To accelerate the adoption of e-invoicing, the recently passed Finance Bill amends the Income Tax Act regulate a mechanism that requires Inland Revenue Board of Malaysia (IRBM)'s validation prior to issuance of e-invoicing. In addition, the Income Tax legislation would impose mandatory deadline to issue e-invoicing, which will be in phases from August 2024 to July 2025.

The requirement to issue e-invoices is not limited to sale transactions, as a self-billed e-invoice is also required to be issued for purchase of goods and services from foreign vendors. Hence, businesses have to assess the impact of e-invoicing implementation on the existing processes/workflow in place for Customs too. Furthermore, the implementation of e-invoicing also has far reaching consequences on various aspects of businesses, such as human resources.


